“Cooper v. Aaron, the oral argument before the US Supreme Court”
The Bar Association's tribute to the 50th anniversary of **Brown v. Board of Education** (1954)

A reenactment of the landmark 1958 case in which the Supreme Court upheld the order of US District Judge Ronald Davies of Fargo, who had denied the request of the Little Rock, Arkansas school board to suspend a plan to desegregate the public schools. The case led to President Dwight Eisenhower's decision to order federal troops to escort black children through angry mobs to a previously all-white high school in Little Rock. Professor James Coleman and members of the Association will portray the roles of counsel and the members of the Supreme Court.
