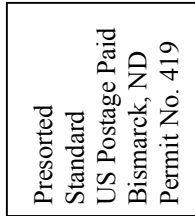

HON. WILLIAM A. HILL has been the United States Bankruptcy Judge for the District of North Dakota since 1983. Judge Hill also served as one of six judges on the Bankruptcy Appellate Panel for the Eighth Circuit from 1996-2002. Judge Hill served as a part time United States Magistrate for the District of ND from 1975-1983. He has also served as a faculty member for North Dakota Federal Practice Seminars, the Federal Judicial Center, the National Business Institute, the Eighth Circuit Judicial Conference, the North Dakota Judicial Institute and the Minnesota State Bar Association Bankruptcy Institute. Judge Hill graduated from UND School of Law in 1971 and Hastings College of Trial Advocacy in 1977.

HON. CHARLES S. MILLER, Jr. is a U.S. Magistrate Judge for the District of North Dakota. He is a UND graduate (B.A., 1973 & J.D., 1976). Previously, he practiced law (Fleck, Mather & Strutz Ltd., 1987-04, & Ohnstad Twichell, P.C., 1976-77) and was an Ass't U.S Attorney (1982-87) and a Basin Electric Power Cooperative staff attorney (1977-82).

HON. DALE V. SANDSTROM has been a Justice of the North Dakota Supreme Court for more than 17 years. He chairs the Court Technology Committee, and previously chaired the Joint Procedure Committee, the North Dakota Judges Association, and the North Dakota Judicial Conference. He is a graduate of NDSU and UND School of Law. He previously served ND as Assistant Attorney General, Securities Commissioner, and Public Service Commissioner.

JIM SNYDER is the Systems Manager for the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, District of North Dakota. Jim received his under graduate degree from North Dakota State University and a graduate degree from the University of Mary. Jim is a graduate of the Federal Courts Leadership Program and has also served as an Adjunct Instructor with the Minnesota School of Business. He has been employed with the Bankruptcy Court for 20 years. He and his family live in Moorhead, MN.
