**Kristine Paranica, J.D.**, is Director of the Conflict Resolution Center at the University of North Dakota, and Adjunct Professor of Law in Alternative Dispute Resolution at the UND School of Law. She is a Fellow of the Institute for the Study of Conflict Transformation, serves on North Dakota's Joint Committee on A.D.R., Chairs the SubCommittee on Family Mediation in ND. She holds Family Practitioner status with the Association of Conflict Resolution, and has published works in the North Dakota Law Review and at Mediate.Com, and has presented at many international, national, statewide and regional conferences. She has co-developed online courses in Leadership and Conflict Resolution through the UND Medical School and Mayo Clinic, and Conflict Resolution: Basics of Conflict Management through UND's Continuing Education program.

**Christopher Cassetta, J.D.**, is a Conflict Management Consultant at the UND Conflict Resolution Center. His roles at the Center include mediation facilitation, education, development and marketing. Christopher received his initial mediation training from the Center as a student in the UND Peace Studies Program and the School of Law, with additional training at the Austrian Center for Peace and Conflict Resolution training program for civilian peacekeeping staff. He has worked as a civilian consultant for numerous international governmental and non-governmental organizations in the areas of conflict management, post-conflict reconstruction, democracy building, rule of law development, and human rights protection and promotion, including diverse field-mission experience. Christopher also served as the Publications Officer for the Raoul Wallenberg Institute for Human Rights and Humanitarian Law, and as an affiliated lecturer for the Lund University School of Law L.L.M Program in Human Rights and Humanitarian Law. He has published and lectured internationally on the topics of civilian peacekeeping missions, human rights, and corporate social responsibility.

**Dwain Fagerlund** is a graduate of the University of North Dakota School of Law, with distinction, and is licensed to practice in North Dakota and Minnesota state and federal courts. He practiced for 15 years with the firm of Johannson, Rust, Fagerlund, Yon & Stock, P.A. in Crookston, Minnesota, where he served as Vice President and a managing shareholder. Subsequently, he established the consulting and alternative dispute resolution firm, *The Lawyers Consultant*, to help fellow attorneys and firms enhance productivity through practice management and conflict resolution.
